Valley Unified Buddies Take Life Skills Trip to Disney

In March, 23 local teens took the ultimate life skills trip to Disney World in Florida thanks to the organizational efforts of Valley Unified Buddies and a \$10,000 grant award from The Essex Foundation. The nonprofit group is made up of Unified Sports, a registered program of Special Olympics, and Valley Buddies. The group provides high school students with intellectual and developmental disabilities every opportunity to succeed in school, their jobs and in life. A once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for most students, the entire trip was designed to put everything they have been learning into practice - from following directions to get through security; to displaying proper social behavior while traveling by airplane and during the hotel stay; to planning their time and paying for meals.

Essex Veterans Memorial Hall Breaks Ground on Expansion

Members of the Essex Veterans Memorial Hall (EVMH) held a groundbreaking ceremony for the expansion of the building that serves as a resource for members, their families, and the greater community. Special recognition was given to The Essex Foundation for its matching gift fundraising campaign that resulted in a \$100,000 grant award- \$50,000 from community donors matched by \$50,000 from the Foundation.



Daffodil Project Blooms Bright in Centerbrook & Ivoryton



The Foundation was honored by the Essex Board of Trade as the selected organization celebrated by Essex Ed during the Groundhog Day parade in January. "Ed" was decorated with daffodils in recognition of the Foundation's community planting efforts, including the newest blooms along Mill Race on South Main Street in Ivoryton and at Stanley Park in Centerbrook, both in cooperation with the Essex Land Trust.

Reverend Kurt Saenger-Heyl, Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church on Main Street in Centerbrook, reached out to The Essex Foundation with a simple yet vital holiday wish. The church needed an onsite, automated external defibrillator (AED) and he hoped the foundation could help fund the purchase and installation of the emergency medical equipment. AEDs are designed to be simple to use by the layperson as well as people with first-aid, first responder, and CPR training to assist people in cardiac arrest. Response was quick with approval to grant funds

to cover the \$2,349 cost, allowing the equipment to be installed over the winter months.
